Terms and Conditions

Allocation of places - Places are filled on a 'first come first served' basis. If a group lesson is not available, individual lessons may be offered until a group lesson is available. Late applications will be placed on a waiting list.

Lesson times - Lessons are 30 minutes and will take place during class times and scheduled on a 'rotating timetable' basis to minimize disruption to other studies. Senior students will be given priority for lunchtime and after-hours lessons.

Missed lessons - Students are responsible for attending lessons and must notify their tutor (in advance) if a lesson will be missed. A "make-up" lesson will then be scheduled where possible at no extra charge. If a tutor is not notified before a lesson is missed, the lesson fee will remain and parents will be informed via SMS or email. Group lessons cannot be rescheduled as the tutor is still required to teach the lesson for the group.

Participation in ensembles - Students are required to participate in at least one ensemble. There is no additional cost.

Commitment for fees and withdrawal from program – Although enrolment and commitment for fees is for the school year, a credit for unused lessons will be processed where notice of withdrawal (in writing) is received prior to 6th March 2020 (Semester 1) and prior to 26th July 2020 (Semester 2).
